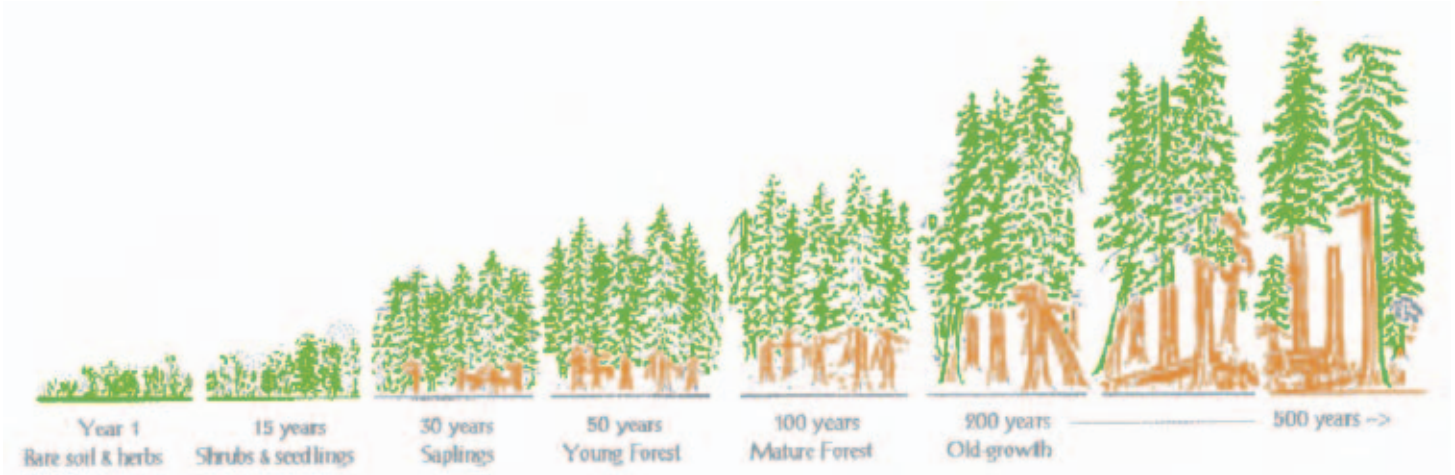


OLD-GROWTH AGAIN

PENNY'S LOUNGE CHAIR ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS



Thank you for purchasing Old-Growth Again (OGA) patio furniture. OGA is dedicated to restoration forestry. Patio furniture sales fund our restoration of California Redwood forestland.



TOOLS REQUIRED: ½-inch ratchet and a mallet or small hammer.

- Your Penny's lounge chair was partially disassembled into 4 parts: 1 back rest, 1 bed, and 2 wheel assemblies. (photo A).
- The lounge bed and back rest are re-assembled with 3 or 4 3 ½" long carriage bolts (depending on the size – whether single, honeymooner or double).
- Your furniture was fully assembled in the shop prior to being dismantled for shipping. All the parts fit.
- The parts that go together have the same numbers written next to the predrilled holes they attach to.
- Please take the time to align the parts with the numbers.
- If you are forcing a bolt in, the part may be turned around or not aligned properly.
- Tap the bolt all the way into the wood to set the bolt. This assures that the bolt will not spin when you tighten it. Add a washer and lightly tighten. Do not over-tighten or you'll crush the wood and weaken your furniture's structural strength.
- The photos attached to these instructions show a Penny's single lounge chair. The double & honeymooner have the same parts and assembly is identical. Complete assembly takes approximately 10 minutes.

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Guide the bolts through the bed frame to attach the backrest to the bed. Add the washer and nut and tighten a bit. Don't overtighten or you'll crush the redwood. The Penny's single lounge chair has 3 bolts that attach the backrest to the bed. The Penny's double & honeymooner sized lounge chairs have 4 bolts.
